COVID-19 Daily Briefing

December 7, 2020

Updated weekdays by approximately 12:30pm

There are 190 new cases reported today. Over the weekend, there were 268 new cases and two deaths reported on Saturday, and 281 new cases and two deaths reported on Sunday. There have been 14,919 laboratory-confirmed cases in Forsyth County. All daily cases reported by the State are presumed Forsyth County residents but may later transfer to another county if the case is later identified as not residing in Forsyth County. Of the 14,919, 12,074 are presumed recovered. The case count is subject to change throughout the day but will only be reported once per day in the daily briefing.

The Public Health Director will provide a detailed briefing at 2:00pm at the beginning of the Board of County Commissioners December 10th meeting, which will be conducted remotely. Public Health Director Comment

Public Health Director Joshua Swift commented, "The uptick in cases is evidence that there is wide community spread of COVID-19 in Forsyth County. As our cases per day goes up, it is even more critical that everyone wear a mask, social distance and wash your hands often. We all know what to do; we just have to do it."
